Rich Davis is the Managing Director of Corporate Security with the Network Operations and Security division at United Airlines. He has been with United since May of 1978.

Rich has spent the last 28 years in the Corporate Security department at United Airlines, where he directs the broad range of aviation security issues surrounding the airline and the airports through which United operates. This involves working in close partnership with federal, state, and local governments and in concert with airport authorities and other airlines. He has been a member of both the International Air Transport Association (IATA) Security Committee and the Airlines for America (A4A) Security Committee since 1997. He is a six-time Chairman of the A4A Security Committee and was Chairman of the IATA Security Committee in 2008-2009 after serving as Vice-Chairman in 2006-2007. Rich is also a member of the U.S. State Department's Overseas Security Advisory Council (OSAC 2007-2017) and the FBI's Domestic Security Alliance Council (DSAC 2008-2017) where he serves both on the Executive Working Group and chairs the Threats and Intelligence Committees. Rich also serves on the Board of Directors of the International Security Management Association (ISMA), the International Security Foundation (ISF) and the Domestic Security Partnership (DSP).

Prior to his appointment as Managing Director of Corporate Security, Rich held positions of Director and Manager with the Security Department. He has also served as a Senior Staff Representative and Coordinator with Security. He was selected as a member of the team that produced the Baseline Working Group Report in 1996 and was also an original member of the FAA Security Equipment Integrated Product Team.
